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#### Introduction

This Site Compliance Plan (SCP):

- a) corresponds with the version of the DOE Order on Protective Force Operations listed in the Prime Contract,
- b) outlines the specific CRD sections that apply to SLAC and the respective method of compliance clarifies that the Lab "In compliance"
- c) correlates and compares SLAC's Safeguards and Security Program and Site Security Plan with the CRD of this Order, and
- d) documents recurring deliverables\* and DOE-approved methods of compliance for applicable requirements.

#### Impact on the Contract:

Under the SCP, sections of the Order are incorporated into the Contract as-is, unless the SCP indicates that a section or portion thereof is inapplicable, or the section has been changed. Thus, for example, if "in compliance" is listed next to a section, that section is incorporated into the Contract as-is. However, where an SCP indicates that

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a section or portion thereof is inapplicable, the section or portion thereof is excluded from the Contract. In addition, where a section or portion thereof is applicable, but changes to the section have been agreed by the Parties, the section, as modified by the Parties, shall be incorporated into the Contract. The SCP also memorializes the Parties' agreement on how SLAC will comply with sections of the Order (whether or not modified).
